

POLICE K-9 TRAINING





HJEMKOMST CENTER LIGHTS



Help light Moorhead's skyline. Programmable, color changing flood lights will give the ability to light up the Hjemkomst Center 'tent' for momentous community events, holidays, special occasions, etc.

INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND



Just as Moorhead's Miracle Field (located in Southside Regional Park) has opened baseball to young athletes with mobility challenges, we envision an inclusive playground where children of all abilities can play together. Recreation space with covered play decks, swings, and sensory play equipment with ramps and wheelchair access would make this possible.



SOUTHSIDE REGIONAL PARK AMENITIES

A Master Plan for Southside Regional Park Complex has been partially implemented. The Park is home to a number of Moorhead's youth sporting organizations, including soccer, lacrosse, football, and baseball. Planned amenities include additional parking for 120 vehicles, a large picnic shelter, field lighting, and a championship field with turf, bleachers, and lighting.

Opportunities:

Championship field with synthetic turf, bleachers, and lighting - \$1.5 million Additional Parking (120 vehicles) - \$300,000 Large Picnic Shelter - \$600,000 Field Lighting for 5 fields - \$150,000 per field or \$750,000 Matson Field is Moorhead's premier baseball complex serving youth to amateur baseball teams and tournaments. A covered grandstand for fans and visitors would replace existing metal bleachers at Matson. A new monument sign would also be part of the project. The preferred design is modeled after one in West Fargo.

BLUESTEM PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

FOOD FOREST

The amazing amphitheater at Bluestem is home to Trollwood Performing Arts Center and hosts local, regional and national acts for concerts and events enjoyed by the greater metro area and beyond. A pedestrian/bike bridge over the Red River near Bluestem would make it easier for our North Dakota neighbors to partake in Bluestem offerings and reduce traffic congestion during events. It would also further connect the two cities' wonderful bike and pedestrian trail system.

Opportunity: \$2.5 million



The M.B. Johnson Food Forest was planted in partnership with the Moorhead Community Resilience Task Force in 2021. A community food forest is a diverse planting of fruit and nut trees, berry bushes, pollinator-friendly plants, and more that is open for public benefit. Food forests provide numerous benefits -- including public access to fresh fruits, a space for community, opportunities to learn about food systems and nature, and pollinator habitat.

Donations will go toward costs associated with the M.B. Johnson Food Forest, such as signage, maintenance, replacement of trees, or future additions to the forest.

Opportunity: \$10,000

Opportunities Under \$12,000

Program Scholarships

Moorhead Parks & Recreation offers scholarships to underprivileged youth for up to three programs per year as funds are available. Donations to the Scholarship Fund would allow more children to participate, enriching their lives by boosting confidence, supporting active play, and encouraging the growth of friendship and community pride.

Opportunity: Any amount

Public Art (Sculptures - Placemaking - etc.)

Celebrate our community through public art and experiences. Public art and placemaking will celebrate Moorhead's story, build interest and create places and spaces where people want to gather. Help activate spaces throughout Moorhead with art and artistic expressions – such as sculptures, murals, dynamic digital art displays – in our downtown, river corridor or other public places. Public Art will celebrate Moorhead's diverse, eclectic and funky culture and be consistent with our Public Art Policy.

Opportunity: Based on scope

Heritage/Interpretive Markers

Heritage markers/plaques are opportunities to communicate Moorhead's local history. These markers will be placed at key areas in historic areas of the City, such as the historic Works Progress Administration (WPA) building (formerly the American Legion), Davy Memorial Park, the Log Cabin, Woodlawn Park, and Bowman Park, as well as other areas along walking paths that provide information about Moorhead's natural environment.

Opportunity: \$2,500 per plaque

Disc Golf Signage/Hole Markers

Moorhead currently has one disc golf course in Woodlawn Park. Flood-resistant hole markers will enhance the game for this popular free pastime!

Opportunity: \$5,000

Benches

Benches provide respite in our recreation areas and may also serve as a tribute or memorial to a loved one.

Opportunity: \$950 per bench

Park Identification Signs

Weather-safe concrete signs to replace existing, deteriorating wood signage would clearly identify our parks and welcome visitors for decades to come.

Opportunity: \$2,500 to \$3,000

Bicycle Racks

Moorhead's many cyclists would benefit by bike racks strategically located throughout the City.

Opportunity: \$850

Bicycle Repair Stations

These deluxe stations give peace of mind to our cyclists by providing tools and an air pump to fix issues that may otherwise spoil plans for a adventurous or leisurely bike ride. Gooseberry and MB Johnson parks currently each have one repair station.

Opportunity: \$1,500 per station

Street Banners

Recognize and share the artistic talents of local artists and welcome visitors to our downtown by funding street banners. Visual arts have significant positive impact on our identity and sense of community.

Opportunity: \$1,000 to \$5,000

Trees for Parks/Boulevards

Not only do trees conserve energy, reduce pollution, and enhance our community and neighborhoods, trees may provide a living tribute to honor or memorialize a loved one. A central plague in the Parks Administrative Office acknowledges each donation.

Opportunity: \$200 and up

City Artificial Christmas Tree

A 25-foot artificial Christmas Tree would welcome holiday visitors in the Moorhead Center Mall Plaza near the entrance to Moorhead City Hall, serving as the official City Christmas tee.

Opportunity: \$12,000
